## Who are we:

Birati Globe Vision Society (BGVS) is a Non-Profit Organization registered under **Govt. of West Bengal Act XXVI of 1961** bearing No.- **S/1L/47048**, focusing on underprivileged Section of the society by providing quality education through skill development, communication, etc. Try to develop socio economic condition of their parents for supporting self-sustainability. We focus in Paraganas & Burdwan districts of West Bengal at present and to grow PAN India. BGVS believes in enabling self-sustainable family which supports every child to have their fundamental right towards education and upliftment of self, while supporting in uplifting the socio-economic condition of the people in rural, economically backward areas of India.

## Our Vision:

Provide quality education to underprivileged section of the society through use of relevant technology, tool, industry-based learning models, physical education, etc. eventually supporting employability leading to a self-reliant family.

## Our Mission:

- Develop, create, co-create schools for the underprivileged society supporting subsidized or free education.
- Develop, train youth with the industry relevant knowledge and experience to be employable.
- Support Parental economic through increased self-employment, investments in generating self-employment, developing skills to be employable, etc.
- Education dropouts' rehabilitation of education through parallel, self-sustainability employment, etc.

### **What we have done so far:**

BGVS was conceived in 2009, initially focusing on job-oriented training programs. During 2014 we felt that developing at grassroot level would bring in more positive and long lasting positive impact over the society and then we added free English medium school at Durganagar slum Area in Birati region, while continued support in job-oriented training.

BGVS now manages 3 schools in three districts of West Bengal offering quality education to ~750 students. During the journey we realized support to the parents/elders through skill development relevant to the society and support towards self-employment of the underprivileged student is equally important for his/her continuation of education and towards holistic growth of the society.

### **How we are different:**

Focussing on education as per government standards for children, supporting this with most relevant tools and technology, teaching staff, and physical wellbeing, focus on school drop out rehabilitation, empower and enabling the parents (specially mothers) to become independent economically.

### **Reason Behind Choosing this Area :**

Parangas & Burdwan districts of West Bengal are few of those regions which are poverty stricken, educationally backward area for the mass. Over the years due to the economic condition education has not be in focus creating more challenges for the growing adults in their acceptance and employability.

### **Predicament:**

We believed our efforts could yield better results if we start working in the economically backward areas which generally have all the basic need related issues, impacting directly or indirectly quality education, leading to employability, family upbringing, social discriminations, economic disparity, lacking the ability to stand strong, access to basic information and knowledge etc. we focused on Parganas and Burdwan Districts of West Bengal.

## Our Schools:

### 1. Knowledge প্রভাত:-

It is a Free English Medium School whose goal is to provide top value added education children of the society. The students of this school are mainly first generation of learner came from the nearby slums.



### 2. MSVR Mission Academy, Dwarir Jangal:-

After Amphan cyclone we visited this area and with the help of AIBEA (All India Banking Employment Association) we were able to rebuild the school. The school building is also used as a Cyclone Shelter Centre in this region. This is **the First English medium** school in that region and its surrounding islands.



### 3. MSVR Mission Academy, Gangatikuri:-

The School building was offered to use as an English medium school by an Ex-IAS officer at an event on education. This is **the First English medium schools** in that region and surrounding 32 villages.
